Epiphany Proclamation 2017

While a day like Christmas is fixed in our minds and on the calendars on December 25th, many of the important feasts of the Church year move, based upon the date that Easter is set. Easter changes each year moving to the Sunday after the "Paschal Full Moon," and can fall between March 22 and April 25

In ancient times before calendars were common, most people did not know the dates for the upcoming Liturgical year. On Epiphany Sunday, the upcoming dates were "proclaimed". After the singing of the Gospel, a Deacon or cantor, in keeping with an ancient practice of Holy Church, announces from the ambo the moveable feasts of the current year according to *this formula:

Know, dear brethren, (brothers and sisters,) that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

On the First day of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the Sixteenth day of April you will celebrate with Joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the Twenty-Fifth day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the Fourth day of June the feast of Pentecost.

On the Eighteenth day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the Third day of December, the First Sunday of Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Epiphany - the great showing, the great Missionary feast.



The Greek word epiphany means to show, to reveal, to manifest.

On Epiphany the Church celebrates the revelation of the newly born Christ-child, Messiah, and savior to the nations. This was symbolically done through the visit of the three wise men.

So from the very beginning of His earthly life Christ wanted the whole world to know that He was their only Lord and Savior. As Christ matured so did His zeal and earnestness to tell the whole world who He is and what He stands for.

He commissioned His Church to continue His work on Earth until He comes again. This is the missionary work of the Church. This is the work that every member of the Church must fulfill. For 2,000 + years the Church has obeyed Christ and what started with a dozen followers has now morphed into hundreds of millions.

The logic behind Epiphany is quite simple. Good news is hard to keep quiet, but excellent, life saving news is impossible (and immoral) to keep quiet.

Jesus is the good news. Jesus is the Epiphany. Spread the word!

PARISH MEMBERSHIP

As a member of the Church you are accepting the responsibility of supporting God's work here through giving of your time, talent and worthy weekly offering to show your love for Christ and your gratitude for His many favors. When moving out of the parish, or changing address or phone number please notify the rectory.

SACRAMENTS

Our young people participate in the Sacraments of Eucharist, Penance and Confirmation as a class after classroom instruction is completed. Individual arrangements may be made for special situations.

Anointing of the Sick: Parishioners are urged to call the rectory immediately in case of emergency. Also, please call to notify the staff prior to hospitalization or if shut-ins, the aged, or ill require staff visits or the Eucharist.

Baptism: Parents are encouraged to call the rectory before the birth of their baby to make arrangements for preparation classes.

First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation of children are sacraments that require a two year preparation process. Children should be enrolled in St. Mary Magdalene School or PREP.

Matrimony: Couples are encouraged to make arrangements at least 6 months in advance of the intended date. The diocese requires a marriage preparation program.

Reconciliation: Individual confessions 30 minutes before the Saturday Mass or by appointment. Call Fr. Ron for an appointment. Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent.
